Kap Lian Thang, 67, of Frederick, Maryland, has passed away at approximately 7:40 a.m. on Monday, October 9, 2017, at Lorien Nursing Home in Mount Airy. He was a beloved teacher who taught high school in Tahan, Burma, for 22 years until he eventually moved to the United States in 2001. He had a lively personality, making jokes every now and then.
