Mr. James Dorsey “J.D.” King, 85, of Frederick, passed away peacefully at home on April 3, 2023. He was the loving husband of Doris Jean King, his wife of nearly 51 years.

Born January 22, 1938, in Frederick County, Jimmy was the son of the late Dorsey Edwin and Ruth Rebecca (Keeney) King. He graduated from Frederick High School in 1956 and worked for many years as a truck driver. With his wife he owned and operated a trucking company, King Transportation.
