She completed her schooling from Sacred Heart Convent School in Dalhousie. She earned a Bachelors of Science degree from Home Science College in Chandigarh and went on to complete a Bachelors of Education from Punjab University.

Simi was the eldest of three sisters. She married Ashok (Ash) Kapur, in 1979 in Dehradun, India and moved to Northern Ireland, where the Kapur family had settled. Ash and Simi traveled around the world as a newly married couple wherever Ash's work took them. Soon after, they welcomed their daughter, Preeya Kapur. 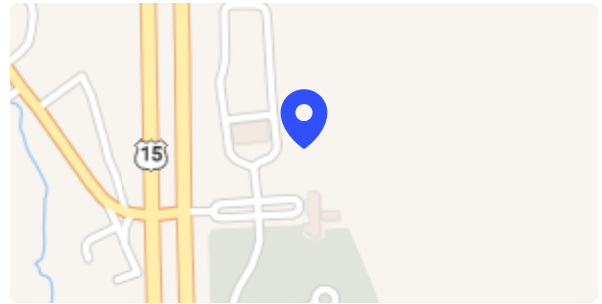
